He is a Visiting Professor at the School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Monash University, and is also the immediate Past President of the Asia-Pacific Academic Consortium for Public Health (APACPH).

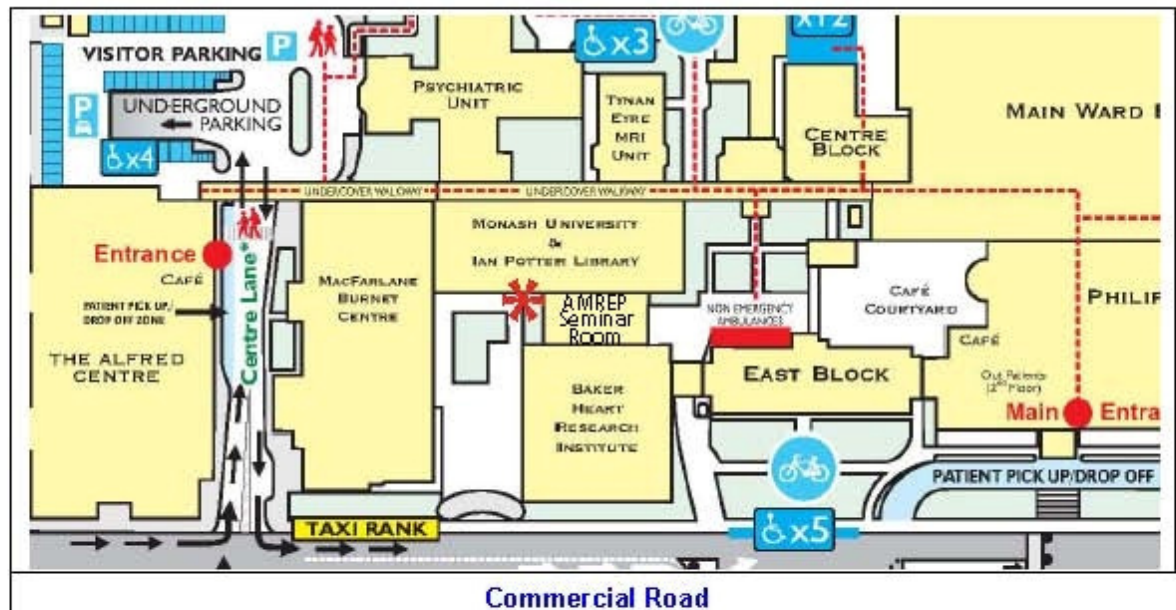

## How to Get to AMREP at the Alfred Hospital



### Car parking

Parking is available off Commercial Road (via Centre Lane) in the Alfred Centre visitors carpark at a nominal hourly rate.

### Taxi

There is a taxi rank directly outside the Bumet Building which is located in front of the AMREP Education precinct.

### Public Transport

Public transport (via tram number 72) stops directly outside the Alfred Hospital main entrance and runs from the Melbourne CBD along St Kilda Road into Commercial Road.
